Rules

ALL cattle brought to the Saginaw fair must follow the Michigan Department of Ag health rules according to TB regulations.

All cattle must be tagged with proper identification.

Certificates must be made available upon request by the superintendent or health officer.

NO ID TAGS – NO UNLOADING!!!

ALL CATTLE MUST HAVE RFID TAG IN EAR.

Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated by the Board of Directors. Exhibitors, family members and guest may be removed from the fairgrounds if such conduct warrants. The Superintendent’s word is final and no refund of fees will be given.

Identifying exhibitor number should be worn. No award can be paid on any animal not actually appearing in the judging ring.

WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO LIMIT ENTRIES TO INDIVIDUALS OR FARM UNITS BASED ON THE NEED FOR BARN SPACE.

CHECK-IN: All animals are to arrive during the allotted check-in time so they can be inspected. All animals arriving at the fairgrounds MUST be pre-washed and clean and in a clean trailer. Any animals and trailers not arriving clean and at the appropriate time will be sent home.

RELEASE TIME: will be 10 PM on Saturday. Exhibitor will forfeit the premium awarded on any animals removed before time stated.

PREMIUMS: All premiums will be paid BY MAIL as soon as possible after the Fair. No premiums will be awarded on animals which are not properly fitted for show purposes. Premiums and ribbons shall be restricted to each exhibitor to not more than two in any class.

Premium Awards may be withdrawn or paid in part should an emergency exists and circumstances warrant reduction.

PREMIUMS WILL BE PAID ACCORDING TO THE JUDGES BOOK AND NOT BY RIBBONS AWARDED.

Champions: Only first place animals will be eligible to compete for champion prizes. Awarding of Champion Ribbon is at the discretion of the judge.

Herd: To consist of three cows over two years old. Each must have had at least one calf.

Best Three Females: Any age, all bred and owned by the exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.

Aged Herd: To consist of five animals; two cows three years old or over, one cow two years old and under three, heifer one year old and under two, heifer under one year old, all owned by exhibitor.

Yearling Herd: To consist of 3 animals one year old and under two; two heifers or three heifers, all owned by exhibitor.

Daughter Dam: Class to consist of Dam and one Daughter. Daughter must be an Intermediate Calf or older.

Produce of Dam: Group to consist of two animals, any age, the produce of one cow. The dam must be named. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry from the same dam.

Junior Calf: Born in current calendar year on or after March 1st and before July 1st

Intermediate Calf: Born between December 1st last year and February 28th this year

Senior Calf: Born between September 1st and November 30th

Junior Yearling: Born between March 1st and August 31st

Senior Yearling: Born between September 1st and February 28th preceding the basic age for Junior Yearling

Animals not eligible for registration may be shown in their breed group and age class providing they originate from a herd with a positive birth record and sire and dam can be ascertained. If you wish to enter in this class you must include all the information on the entry form at time of application.

All cattle must be tagged with proper identification. **NO ID TAGS – NO UNLOADING!!!** ALL CATTLE MUST HAVE RFID TAG IN EAR.

Certificates must be made available upon request by the superintendent or health officer.

We reserve the right to limit entries to individuals or farm units based on the need for barn space.

Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated by the board of directors. Exhibitors, family members and guest may be removed from the fairgrounds if such conduct warrants. The Superintendent's word is final and no refunds will be given. Identifying exhibitor number should be worn. No award can be paid on any animal not actually appearing in the judging ring.

CHECK-IN: All animals are to arrive during the allotted check-in time so they can be inspected. All animals arriving at the fairgrounds **MUST** be pre-washed and clean and in a clean trailer. Any animals and trailers not arriving clean and at the appropriate time will be sent home.

RELEASE TIME: will be 10 PM on Saturday. Exhibitor will forfeit the premium awarded on any animals removed before time stated.

PREMIUMS WILL BE PAID ACCORDING TO THE JUDGES BOOK AND NOT BY RIBBONS AWARDED.

Champions: Only first place animals will be eligible to compete for champion prizes. Awarding of Champion Ribbon is at the discretion of the judge.

Herd: To consist of three cows over two years old. Each must have had at least one calf.

Best Three Females: Any age, all bred and owned by the exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.

Aged Herd: To consist of five animals; two cows three years old or over, one cow two years old and under three, heifer one year old and under two, heifer under one year old, one bull any age (optional, can replace any female), all owned by exhibitor.

Yearling Herd: To consist of 3 animals one year old and under two; bull (optional), two heifers or three heifers, all owned by exhibitor.

Daughter Dam: Class to consist of Dam and one Daughter. Daughter must be an Intermediate Calf or older.

Produce of Dam: Group to consist of two animals, any age, either sex, the produce of one cow. The dam must be named. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry from the same dam.

Junior Calf- Born in current calendar year before April 30

Senior Calf- Born between Sept 1st and Dec 31st last year.

Junior Yearling- Born between Jan 1st and Apr 30 last year

Summer Yearling- Born between May 1st and Aug 31st last year

Senior Yearling- Born between Sept 1st and Dec 31st preceding the basic age for Jr Yearling

Animals not eligible for registration may be shown in their breed group and age class providing they originate from a herd with a positive birth record and sire and dam can be ascertained. If you wish to enter in this class you must include all the information on the entry form at time of application.

RULES

All Goats brought to the Saginaw Fair must follow the Michigan Department of Ag health rules according to TB and Scrapie regulations. All goats need to have official USDA tags, micro-chip, or have a tattoo.

Scrapie Tattoos: For goats, legible official registry tattoos must be recorded in a goat purebred registry association's book, and official documentation must accompany the animal. A scrapie tattoo must be legible and include both the scrapie flock ID and the unique herd management number. Scrapie tattoos can be placed in the ear, tail web, or flank. Exhibitors with tattooed goats MUST attach a copy of official documentation to the exhibitor's registration. Exhibitors with micro-chipped goats MUST provide their own reader, and MUST attach a copy of official documentation to the exhibitor's registration.

NO ID TAGS – NO UNLOADING!!!!

Health rules will be strictly enforced.
ABSOLUTELY NO MEDICATIONS ARE TO BE ADMINISTERED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS. ANY MEDICATIONS NEED TO HAVE APPROVAL OF SUPERINTENDENT AND FAIR VETERINARIAN.

Buck goats born before January 1 of current year cannot be exhibited or housed at the Saginaw Fair
Any intact wether will be disqualified from competition.
Wether goats will not be eligible to compete in Champion Breed Classes.

All does must be milked dry the night before the show.
Only goats with horns removed or disbudded animals are permitted. Scurs cannot be longer than 1 inch. Angoras and Borsers may be shown with horns.

All pens must be cleaned by exhibitor when animal is released.

Each exhibitor is limited to not more than 15 exhibits in this department. Only two entries per class will be allowed except group classes where only one group entry will be allowed. UNSPORTSMANLIKE conduct will not be tolerated by the board of directors. Exhibitors, family members or guest will be removed from the fairgrounds if such conduct is warranted. The Superintendent's word is final and no refund of fees will be given. Identifying number should be worn. No award can be paid on any animal not actually appearing in the judging ring. Animals deemed unfit or unworthy for show by the Board of Management or the Judge will not be considered for awards in any class

PENS: Specify on entry application number of pens needed.

HOUSING: All livestock may be housed in tents during the current fair. Your cooperation and consideration will be greatly appreciated by all concerned. Thank you!

BEDDING: All bedding will be wood shavings or sawdust. Wood shavings will be sold at the fair for those who need them.
All pens will be cleaned before release. Premiums may be withheld if cages are not cleaned.

CHECK IN: All animals are to arrive during the allotted check-in time so they can be inspected. All animals arriving at the fairgrounds MUST be pre-washed and clean and in a clean trailer. Any animals and trailers not arriving clean and at the appropriate time will be sent home.

RELEASE TIME: 10:00 PM on Saturday. Please pre-arrange time with Superintendent. Exhibitor will forfeit the premium awards on any animal removed before stated time and without Superintendent knowledge.

PREMIUMS: All premiums will be paid by MAIL as soon as possible after the Fair. Premium Awards may be withdrawn or paid in part should an emergency exist and circumstances warrant reduction especially if all rules and specifications aren't followed. Award will not include ribbon unless stated.

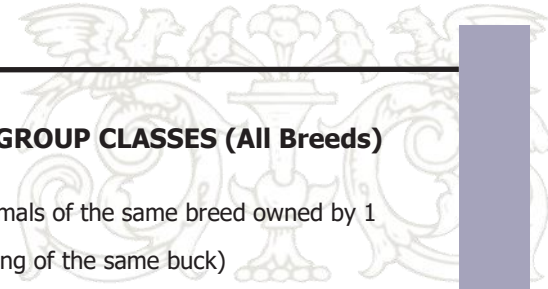

Stall assignments will be posted on stall board in Horse Barn one (1) week before Fair for exhibitor convenience. There will be absolutely no horse exhibit entries after June 30. From June 15-30 \$30 late fee will be charged. If entries are not in office by June 30, it will not be accepted. Late entries will be approved if space allows. If capacity limits are met Saginaw County residents will take precedence.

Horse Show Pony Classes—to be eligible to ride in these classes: exhibitor must be 15 and under, pony must be 48 inches or less and exhibitor/pony may not ride in any other classes except those marked **PONY**.

All Riders must be pre-registered. Riders must ride the horse they register with in the classes the rider is registered for as High Point and Overall Champion is based on 1 horse/1 rider combination.

During Horse shows, all exhibitors must be registered as the rider on the exhibit animal. This shall include lead line, pee wee, and walk/trot classes. Due to insurance regulations only exhibitors are allowed to ride horses on the fairgrounds. An exhibitor must buy an exhibitor pass and have an entry form with horse classes listed. If you allow an un-registered person to ride your horse you will be dismissed from the rest of the day's event - this includes, parents, owners, trainers, etc.

Training is done outside of the Fair or after the shows and thus coaching from the sides is NOT allowed. Please prepare before the show and allow exhibitors to use independent judgement while showing. Violators of this rule will receive ONE warning and upon second offense will be asked to leave.

All horses must meet the State of Michigan livestock health requirements. Horse Shows covered by State of Michigan law under the P.A. 351—Michigan Equine Activity Liability Act. Horses will be checked by a vet professional before unloaded onto Saginaw County Fairgrounds property.

Exhibitors must ride in appropriate age division—no moving up. Age is as of January 1st. This Program is open to all counties. You must show same age division in Pleasure and Speed events. Example: If you show in the 12 and under age group in Pleasure events, you must show in the 12 and under group in Speed events. Exhibitors will not be allowed to show **Walk/Trot on day and a different age division on the other day. **Walk/Trot classes are ONLY for those exhibitors who have not cantered/loped in any other shows at our Fairgrounds. Horses who are not ready to canter can exhibit in the green horse class. Walk trot riders are NOT eligible for showmanship sweepstakes. If there is a special need in which we need to accommodate a rider, please let us know. Our goal is to make it possible for everyone to participate.

GREEN HORSE: For our definition, is a broke but inexperienced horse in their first few years of showing and can be judged on their walk/trot or their walk/trot/canter based on the horse's ability. Green horses can ONLY be entered in the Green Horse classes and halter and not entered in ANY other classes for Fair week. Green Horse is not tied to premium dollars or any high point or champion award. Ribbon only.

SPORTSMANSHIP: Poor sportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated on the part of the exhibitor, parents, or visitors for

any reason. Any mistreatment to a horse such as over use of spurs, whips, or rough handling with the bit, will absolutely not be allowed. EXHIBITORS AND/OR SPECTATORS VIOLATING THESE RULES WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE FAIRGROUNDS AND EXHIBITORS WILL RECEIVE NO REFUNDS OF FEES. PREMIUMS WILL BE FORFEITED. The Fair Board and superintendent's decision is final and no refunds of fees will be given.

In case of a High Point tie, ties will be broken by number of first place, if still tied then by second place, etc. All horse shows will run under 4-H rules.

HELMET: Approved ASTM certified safety helmets are required for 4-H aged individuals in all classes. And recommended to be worn by all riders.

HORSE GROOMING: Animals must be properly fitted and groomed by the exhibitor to participate in any class.

You will be given your fair week schedule at the **MANDATORY MEETING the Saturday before Fair at 11:00am in the horse barn.** We ask that you review it and any changes that need to be made be done with STACY at that time. No classes can be added once Fair week has begun.

STALLS: Stall assignments will be posted at the mandatory meeting. All stalls will be assigned based on 4-H club and/or number available. Placement cannot be guaranteed but we will try to accommodate requests. Stall requests must be on the entry form. You will only be assigned the number of stalls on the form. Specify on entry application the number of horses entered and number of stalls needed. Entry fee must be paid on all foals although shown with mare only. These fees must accompany entry. **All stalls must be cleaned before release or forfeit premium.**

Tack Stalls: Must be paid for when assigned—\$25 all week, You will need to request a tack stall on entry form. If available, you will receive an invoice at the mandatory meeting and must be paid for at that time.

RESERVED HORSE STALLS MAY NOT BE USED AS TACK STALLS. If not used by a horse, the stall **MAY NOT BE TRANSFERRED TO ANYONE ELSE FOR ANY REASON**, the stall not used will revert back to the Fair and you will not receive a refund for that stall. Entries will be closed when all stalls are filled. All horses will be housed in those facilities provided.

There will be **No refunds** of Stall fees. Incomplete applications may be disqualified at the discretion of superintendent. Applications may not be changed after the deadline.

BEDDING: Bedding will be wood shavings or sawdust. **NO STRAW.** Bulk wood shavings are provided by the Horse Department. Once they are gone you can buy bagged shavings at the Fair office for \$6 per bag.

STALLIONS: Stallions may not be exhibited.

ARRIVAL TIMES: All horses will be on the grounds on Monday between 2:00 P.M. and 6:30 P.M. Horses will be released on Saturday at 9:00 P.M. unless otherwise directed by superintendent. Horses must remain on trailer until vet/vet tech has cleared them to be put into their stall. Coggins will be matched with your registered animal at that time. Arrival, departure, and judging time will be as stated in rules. All horses must remain in stalls until time of release. Exhibitor will forfeit all premium awarded on any animal removed before time stated.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

*Exhibitors must exhibit in a showmanship class to be eligible for Pleasure HI-POINT award for that day, except for the open speed show. *You must use the same horse for Showmanship since points are based on one rider and one horse combination.

Rain Days: If the show is cancelled because of rain, Hi-points will not be awarded if less than 3 events are completed before cancellation.

If an emergency arises regarding late arrivals, contact the superintendent Patti Copes 989-213-4220.

To be eligible for the Grand Champion and Reserve Halter awards you must have won first or second place in classes 1-4.

No award will be paid on any animal not actually appearing in the judging ring.

Horses to be eligible for championship prizes must have won 1st or 2nd prize in their class.

Animals will not be judged unless exhibitor is wearing identifying exhibitor number.

Showmanship Sweepstakes ages are as follows: Senior 16-19 years, Intermediate 12-15 years, and Junior 9-11 years.

OPEN DOG RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All exhibitors are required to read and abide by the rules.
- **Exhibitor age to be 20 or older.**
- Dogs must be entered on Fair entry form by entry deadline.
- Exhibitors must provide health records at check in; see Youth Dogs for health requirements.
- Dogs must be leashed or crated at all times.
- Dogs may be shown once in a class.
- Dogs shown only in Open classes will not be benched.
- Dogs to be exercised in designated areas only, not in the carnival or midway areas.
- Unaltered dogs may show in any class with the exception of a female dog in heat, which will not be allowed on the grounds. No vicious or unmanageable dogs permitted.
- Exhibitors entering Agility (Division 20) must have experience on the equipment and have trained their dogs for the class.

Dog Health Regulations

- All vaccines must be purchased from, and administered by, a licensed veterinarian.
- Dogs must be current on vaccines for Rabies, DHLPP, and Bordatella (Kennel Cough) which must be current within 6 months of the fair.
- Proof of a negative fecal check for internal parasites dated after June 15th (of current year).
- Proof of a negative heartworm check after March 1st (of current year), and currently on a preventative program, or on a preventative year round program documented and signed by a veterinarian.
- Proof must be provided to the superintendent at check-in; **no dog will be allowed on the grounds without the completed paperwork on the official form.**
